Ukrainians in Poland

IMR continues to serve the Ukrainian refugees in Poland. Nearly 1,000 volunteers on 96 teams have extended compassionate care to Ukrainian refugees, embodying the spirit of selflessness and dedication.

Turkey Earthquakes

When earthquakes struck Syria and Turkey on February 6, 2023, IMR's Disaster Area Response Team (DART) sprang into action, deploying doctors, nurses, and EMTs within 48 hours. Their swift response and dedication led to the rapid approval to oversee a hospital, providing essential supplies and skilled medical care to tens of thousands in need.

Voices from the Field

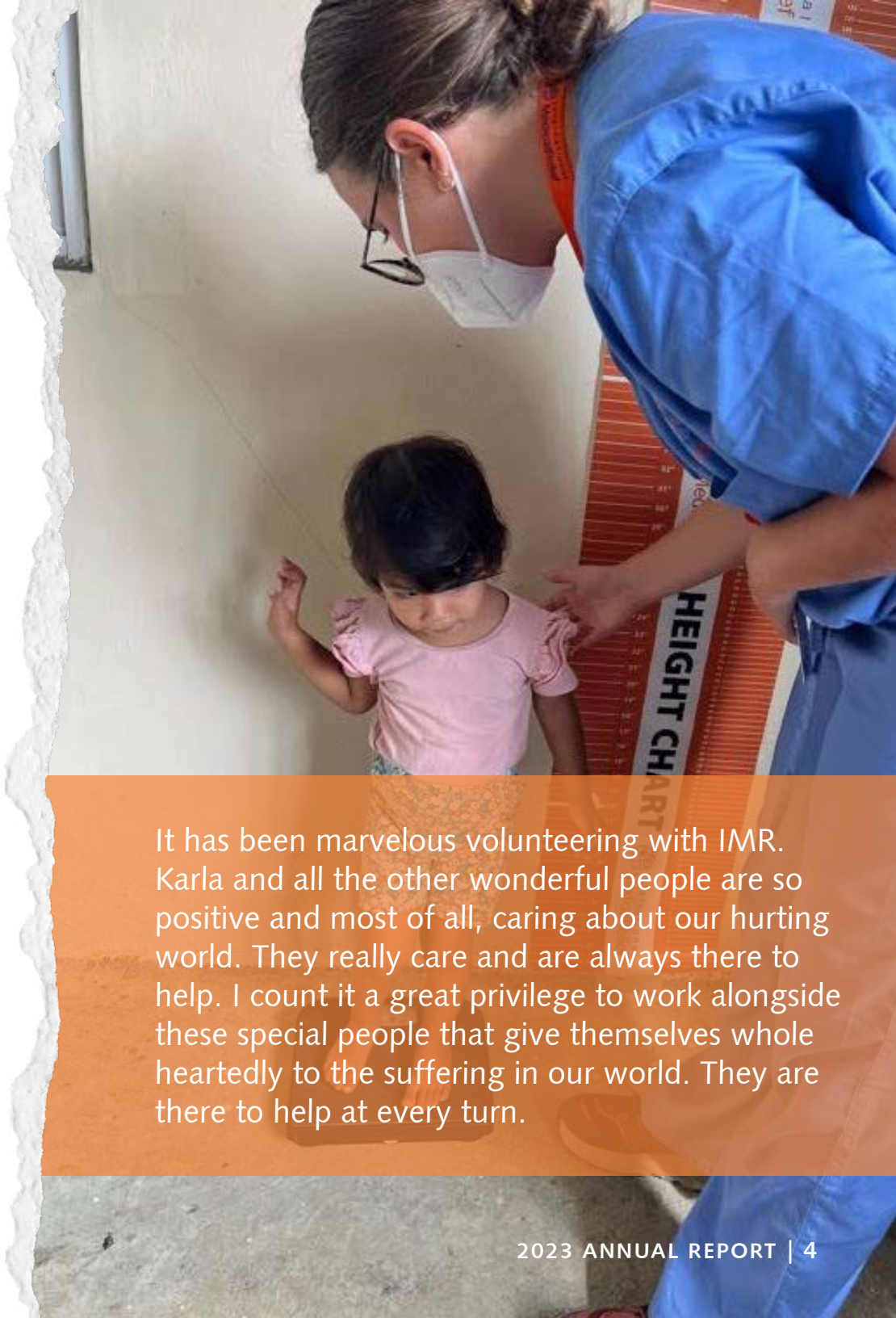

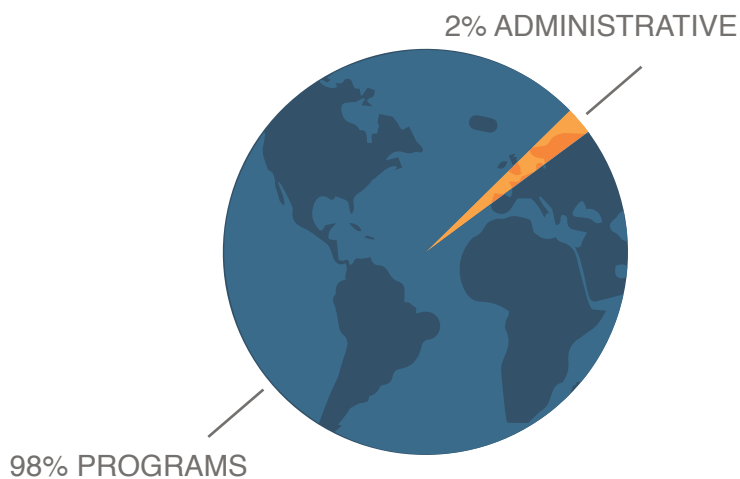
Financial Statements

International Medical Relief operates with just 2% administrative and fundraising costs, so that 98 CENTS of every dollar donated is invested directly into our programs.



For every **\$1** donated to International Medical Relief, more than **\$52** in medicines, medical supplies, and medical services are donated to those in need.

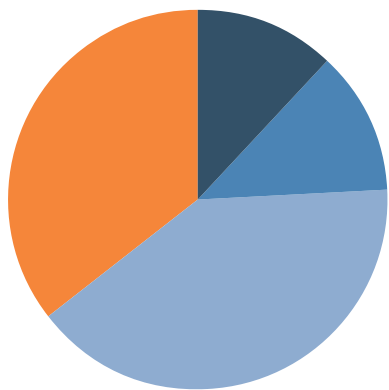
